# - UNAM Foundation's Bursary Programme -

In alignment with the Namibian Government's vision of facilitating increased access to high-quality tertiary education, the UNAM Foundation takes pleasure in confirming its continued commitment towards effectively managing a two-pronged Bursary programme as one of its core activities. Our commitment is aimed at maximising the impact of funds raised to support dedicated students and broadening access to higher education for the Namibian youth.

### Key Features of our Bursary Programme

### 1. Corporate Bursary Funds with naming rights:

We provide corporates the opportunity to structure their own bursary funds, which we manage on their behalf, enabling them to focus on their core business. With over two decades of experience in prudent bursary fund management, we guide corporates towards identifying their target beneficiaries at any registered higher education institution in Namibia, and beyond, based on their corporate priorities and values.

We facilitate the full bursary management cycle, from structuring the fund requirements, to ensuring payments are made based on approved budgets. We ensure regular reporting and facilitate donor-student engagement if so desired.

During 2023, 33 young women and men pursuing undergraduate and/or postgraduate courses were supported through partial and/or full bursaries with the generous support of our partners.

2. Student Financial Assistance Fund: To date, the Foundation used a predominantly event-based approach to actively raise funds to provide once-off assistance to students registered at the University of Namibia facing financial hardships. The Fund provides essential support towards tuition, accommodation, learning materials and employability skills development, while it also caters for non-academic emergencies which could affect academic performance. There is a robust beneficiary selection process in place, supported by the Office of the Dean of Students.

During 2023, the Fund supported 15 students across UNAM's 12 campuses. Numerous students expressed that without this assistance, they would have been unable to pursue their studies during 2023. We welcome organisations and individuals wishing to support this Fund.

The Bursary Programme goes beyond financial assistance. It is an investment in the future of Namibia. By supporting the education of bright and motivated individuals, we contribute to the development of a skilled workforce, producing innovative thinkers and compassionate leaders poised to drive positive change in our society.


